

GUIDELINES ON SAFETY USE OF LIFTS





WHILE BOARDING LIFTS

- To ensure that the lift run smoothly, PRESS the button for the floor required only.
- OBEY the load weight (maximum number of passengers) stated in the lift car. If the lift is full, wait for the next lift.
- The alarm will SOUND when overloading is detected and will only stop once the last user has exited the lift car. The lift will only move when the load has decreased.
- BE CAREFUL on entering the lift in case the lift floor is not level with the landing floor.
- Children must be ACCOMPANIED by adults.

WHILE RIDING LIFTS

- BEHAVE while in the lift. Jumping and playing in the lift may activate the safety device and cause the lift to stop. Use the lift wisely, courteously and safely.
- STAY CLEAR of lift doors, especially when the doors are opening or closing.
- BE CAREFUL not to touch or lean against the lift doors.
 Your hand or arm may be caught, resulting in injury when the doors open.
- To avoid affecting the operation of the lift, DO NOT press lift buttons mischievously.
- To avoid causing any damage to the lift button, DO NOT press with any sharp objects but your fingers.







WHILE EXITING LIFTS

- **EXIT** immediately at your floor do not wait for others behind you.
- DO NOT push people in front of you when exiting the
- **BE CAREFUL** on exiting the lift in case the lift floor is not level with the landing floor.

DON'TS

- DO NOT exceed the permitted load weight. Large and heavy loads may damage the lift.
- DO NOT obstruct movement of the lift doors and damage other equipment in the lift car.
- DO NOT use the lift in the case of fire. Use the stairs instead.
- DO NOT play with the emergency stop button.
- **DO NOT** smoke in the lift car.
- DO NOT allow children to play around the lift lobby area and lean against the doors as it could lead to serious accidents if the doors were to open.







IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY

- When TRAPPED inside the lift, keep calm and summon for help by using the alarm bell and intercom.
- DO NOT attempt to leave the lift car by forcing the doors open.
- It is **SAFER** to stay inside the lift.
- **DO NOT** attempt to rescue the trapped passengers when the lift breaks down unless you are trained.
